is guilty of an indictable offence and liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years."

Publishing an obscene thing (p. 2)

section 163(1)a) of the Criminal Code.

"163. (1) Every one commits an offence who

(a) makes, prints, publishes, distributes, circulates, or has in his possession for the purpose of publication, distribution or circulation any obscene written matter, picture, model, phonograph record or other thing whatever"

Mailing obscene matter (p. 2)

section 168 and 169a) of the Criminal Code.

The Criminal Code reads:

"168. (1) Every one commits an offence who makes use of the mails for the purpose of transmitting or delivering anything that is obscene, indecent, immoral or scurrilous."

The maximum penalty is two years' imprisonment.

Criminally harassing Stephen Harper and others (p. 2)

section 264(1)(3)a) of the Criminal Code.

From the Criminal Code:

"264. (1) No person shall, without lawful authority and knowing that another person is harassed or recklessly as to whether the other person is harassed, engage in conduct referred to in subsection (2) that causes that other person reasonably, in all the circumstances, to fear for their safety or the safety of anyone known to them.

- (2) The conduct mentioned in subsection (1) consists of
- [...]
- (b) repeatedly communicating with, either directly or indirectly, the other person or anyone known to them; [...]
- (d) engaging in threatening conduct directed at the other person or any member of their family."

The maximum punishment is 10 years in prison.
